**S.M. Stoller Corporation Awarded Combined Records Management Subcontract at WIPP**

**CARLSBAD, N.M., October 20, 2008** – Washington TRU Solutions LLC has awarded a combined records management subcontract to The S.M. Stoller Corporation. The initial subcontract is for one year, but, four options, if exercised, could extend its duration to five years. In that case, the total value of the contract could reach \$25 million.

“I’m pleased to announce the records management subcontract award to Stoller,” says WTS President and General Manager Farok Sharif. “They lead a team that is ready to step in and perform with excellence. Their work is critical to the WIPP project.”

Stoller’s team consists of Source One Management, Inc., Triumph Technologies, Inc., and L&M Technologies, Inc. The new subcontract combines several records management functions previously accomplished under separate subcontracts. Stoller currently operates the WIPP Records Archive subcontract. In addition to that scope of work, the new subcontract also brings together Project Record Services, Mail Services and Central Characterization Project Records.

Stoller is headquartered in Broomfield, Colo. and has numerous offices throughout the country, including Carlsbad, N.M. The company has contracts for waste management, remediation, research, records management and other environmental services at U.S. Department of Energy sites in Washington, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Texas and Ohio.
